How I Ended Up At CASA By Janice H.

I am a real alcoholic as described in the Big Book. I began drinking when I was around 16 or 17 years old. Daytona Beach was a great place to live for a budding alcoholic. I believe alcoholism is a family disease, and most likely goes back hundreds of years in my family. My father was an alcoholic of the mean and nasty variety. He was a West Point graduate with a very promising future, but died alone in a VA hospital at the age of 48. The coroner reported cirrhosis of the liver, but not that it was caused by alcoholism.

I grew up mostly afraid, wanting to be invisible and feeling that I didn't belong anywhere, until I discovered alcohol - the solution for ALL that I thought was wrong with me! Drinking allowed me to feel like I belonged. I could be happy, joyous and free from fear — except for a barely noticeable deep inner knowing that something was missing in my life, something meaningful. My last three years of drinking (from 30 to 33 years old), after losing both my mother and boyfriend to cancer, were filled with blackout drinking and driving, missing an increasing amount of work because of severe hangovers, and planning my next drink. After verbally abusing my precious niece who was only 8 years old at the time during a blackout, I knew my drinking had to end. I walked into AA in 1989 and haven't had or craved a drink since, purely through God's grace.

However, I only remained in AA for one year, thinking "I got this now." Some years later I became addicted to a prescription drug for anxiety which landed me in detox resulting in a re-introduction to AA where I immediately felt at home. Not long after I was released from detox, I made CASA my homegroup – it was love at first sight of the doublewide trailer! Well, almost love at first sight, but I knew I was in the right place!

I have been sober and free from alcohol and prescription drug abuse for a little over five years. I discounted what I heard In the beginning, things like "it gets so much better" and "life is more beautiful than I could ever have imagined." This, and so much more, has all come true for me. I have made the most wonderful friends in the program. These friends carried me when I didn't think I would make it, including surviving breast cancer and my own daughter's struggle with alcoholism. Through it all, I have remained sober with endless gratitude that I may now share the solution to this deadly disease with others. And last, but NOT least, my evergrowing relationship with God has been, and continues to be, an indescribable gift…truly amazing grace.
